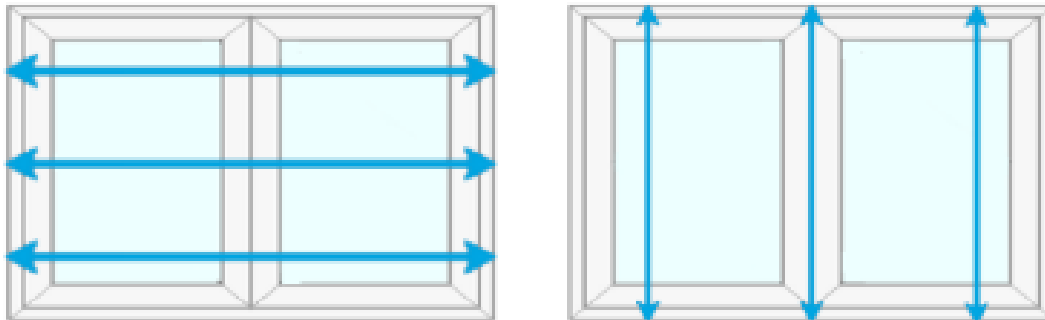


How to measure for replacement windows/doors

Windows/doors that fit perfectly

You've made the decision to replace your home's windows and door, and now you're asking "How do I measure for the replacement?"



As you're aware, it's important you take the right measurements. Here's our guide to measuring for a replacement window or door.

When measuring, always think width x height, and take your measurements from the outside of your house.

The width:

1. Take 3 horizontal measurements in mm at the top, middle and bottom.
2. You need to place your tape measure at the widest part.
3. Note the smallest measurement and take off 10mm. This is your replacement's width.

The height:

1. Take 3 vertical measurements in mm at the left, centre and right.
2. Between top and bottom at the widest part.
3. Note the smallest measurement. This is your replacement's height.

The cill:

1. Measure the depth of your jamb at the deepest part of your window.

Remember:

- Be confident in your measurements, as you can't return made-to-measure products that don't fit.
- Measure the outside brick opening.
